





# Synthetic Drugs: Synthetic Cannabis, Flakka and Fentanyl

This one day Synthetic Drugs training is open to all sworn Law Enforcement officers, corrections, detectives, and intelligence analysts that have interactions or actively investigate synthetic drugs cases. The class is taught by investigators who work on these types of investigations. References and pictures are often from ongoing or past investigations conducted by the instructors. Due to the always changing world of controlled substances, the classroom presentation is always updated for each new group. Participants will gain a basic understanding of the most common controlled substance they may encounter and have a basic understanding of how they affect people under the influence. Participants will be aware of the techniques to properly handle controlled substances and field-testing methods available. Techniques will be provided for a more safe and secure environment when dealing with people possibly under the influence. An understanding of how different substances affect the body and how to identify possible overdose situations will be taught.
